In the 2021-22 school years total of 321,876 students in all grades in Texas public and nonpublic schools took 577,350 Advanced Placement (AP) examinations (Table 1). Texas ranked second in the nation in both number of AP examinees and number of AP examinations taken (Table 365).

Between2020-21 and2021-22, the number of AP examinations takencreasedby 9.5 percent in Texas, compared to 4 percentin the United States a whole Table 1). The number of AP examinations with scores in the Brangeincreasedby 19.2 percentin Texas and by 13.3 percentin the United States The percentage of examinations with scores in the Brangeincreasedby 4.0 percentage points in Texas and by 4.7 percentage points in the United States

In 2021-22, the percentage of AP examinees who reported their race/ethnicity to the College Board as African American, American Indian, Asjattispanic, Pacific Islander, or multiracial was considerably higher inTexas (69.2%) than the United States a whole (49.9%) (Table 2on page 4).
